Reader: (intoned) Amen.


RESURRECTION TROPARION

Priest: Christ is ris - en from the dead, by death, tram-pling death, down up - on and to those in the tombs He has grant - ed life. (3)



Reader: Those who came with Mary anticipated the dawn, but found the stone rolled away from the sepulcher and heard the Angel say: "Why do you seek Him Who abides in everlasting light among those who are dead, as though He were merely a mortal man? See the grave-clothes: go quickly and proclaim to the world that the Lord is risen, and has put death to death; for He is the Son of God, (intoned) Who saves the human race."

KONTAKION OF PASCHA

Mode pl. 4.

Reader: Though You descended into the grave, O immortal One, You overthrew the power of Hades; You arose as victor, O Christ God, saying loudly to the women, "Rejoice;" and You bestowed peace upon Your Apostles, (intoned) O You Who grants resurrection to the fallen.

OIKOS OF PASCHA

Mode 4.

Reader: Before sunrise the myrrh-bearing maidens came as though it were day to seek the Son Who had descended into the grave; and as they went they said to one another: "Come O friends, let us anoint with fragrant spices the life-giving and buried body of Christ Who raised up the fallen Adam; let us hasten like the Magi and adore Christ bringing myrrh as a gift to Him Who is wrapped now not in swaddling clothes but in a burial shroud; and let us weep and cry out to Him: 'Arise, O Master, (intoned) Who grants resurrection to the fallen.'"

SYNAXARION

Reader: On April 18, we commemorate our devout father John, the disciple of Saint Gregory of Dekapolis.

On this day we also commemorate the holy Martyr Savvas the Commander.

First Hymn of Praise


(Verse below begin and end on C.)

Praise Him with the sound of trumpet; praise Him with the psaltery and harp.




Third Hymn of Praise
