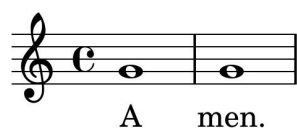
1. Prayer of the Trisagion Hymn

5. *The Lord's Prayer*

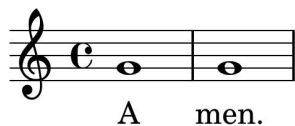
